Adverbial - a word or phrase that has been used like an adverb to add detail or further information to a verb.

Adverbials are used to explain **how**, **where** or **when** something happened; they are like adverbs made up of more than one word:

He stood and waited *under the clock*.

The rabbit hopped *as fast as it could*.

So what do you think a **fronted adverbial** is?

Words or phrases at the beginning of a sentence, used to describe the action (verb) that follows:

Before the sun came up, he ate his breakfast.

As fast as he could, the rabbit hopped away from the fox.
